ENFORCEMENT NOTICE OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Issued by: St Albans District Council

1. This Notice is issued by the council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. The Land To Which The Notice Relates

Land at 1 St. Stephens Avenue St. Albans Hertfordshire Shown edged red on the attached plan.

3. The Matters Which Appear To Constitute The Breach Of Planning Control

It appears to the Council that the following breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years.

Without planning permission the erection of a 1.8 metre fence adjacent to a highway used by vehicular traffic (shown in blue on the attached plan).

4. Reasons For Issuing This Notice

The 1.8 metre fencing along the front and side boundary sections of Plots 1 and 2 is out of keeping with the style and boundary treatments found in the locality and is detrimental to the visual amenity of the neighbourhood. The fence without sufficient landscaping represents a harsh, abrupt feature harming the open character of the junction of Watford Road and St. Stephens Avenue. The fencing as constructed is contrary to Policy 74 of the St.Albans District Local Plan Review 1994 and the aims and objectives of the National Planning Policy Framework March 2012.

5. What You Are Required To Do

Reduce the height of the fence adjacent to the highway to a means of enclosure not exceeding 1 metre in height.

6. Time For Compliance

3 months after this notice takes effect.

7. When This Notice Takes Effect

This notice takes effect on 11 July 2014 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.


ANNEX

Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
