The Experian forecast breaks employment into just 30 sectors, which are listed in the box below. Our mapping of sectors into space requires a finer-grained breakdown. For example, to estimate employment in offices we need to include Publishing, (SIC 22.1). But in the Experian figures Publishing jobs are not shown separately; they are subsumed in the larger category of Paper, Printing and Publishing.

To estimate base year employment in the *'small sectors'* which are not shown separately by Experian, we use the share of each small sector in the Experian *'large sector'* of which it forms part, as shown by Government statistics. Thus, in our example, the Annual Business Enquiry (ABI) for 2001 shows 280 jobs in Publishing in St. Albans, and 590 jobs in Paper, Printing and Publishing. Thus, Publishing provided 47% of St Albans jobs in Paper, Printing and Publishing. We now apply this ratio to the Experian figures, which are different from the ABI for various technical reasons (for example, Experian includes the self-employed, and it aims to correct errors in the ABI). Experian for 2001 shows 901 jobs in Paper, Printing and Publishing. Multiplied by 47%, this produces an estimated 420 jobs in Publishing.

To estimate *future* jobs in Publishing, we assume this ratio of small-sector to large-sector jobs remains constant. For example, in St Albans in 2021 we assume that Publishing in St Albans will continue to account for 47% of jobs in Paper, Printing and Publishing. Experian

shows that for St Albans there will be 360 jobs in Paper, Printing and Publishing in 2021. Multiplied by 47%, this produces 170 jobs in Publishing in St Albans in 2021.

In practice, the shares of 'small sectors' to 'large sectors' of course change over time. As an alternative to the 'fixed-shares' method described above, we have considered using a 'floating-shares' methods, which forecasts such changes in shares over the plan period. But we concluded that such forecasting would not produce robust results, because only limited historical data is available, such data is unreliable at this extreme level of detail, and there is no dependable way of distinguishing long-term structural trends from random fluctuations and cyclical movements.
